God Will Call for Me Soon

From the time I could understand words, my maternal grandmother, Jo Won-mo, consistently taught me one thing, "God is your Father." She went so far as to say, "Your mother is like your nanny who is raising you as God's daughter." Since I had been surrounded by an atmosphere of faith even while in my mother's womb, I accepted this without a second thought. When I heard the word "God," my heart would open unreservedly and fill with warmth.

My mother did not mind investing herself body and soul for the purpose of raising me to reject secular life and follow God's way. She lived with single-minded devotion in absolute unity with and obedience to God. After joining the Unification Church, our family moved to Seoul, where she worked even harder to protect me from the world's temptations. As a result of her dedication, God allowed me to see myself as a noble crane.

Even as an adolescent in middle school,

I poured my heart into quiet reading and study. I attended the Sungjung Girls Middle School, located in Sajik-dong of Seoul's Jongno district. Situated at the southern foot of Mount Inwang, it was a small school that always seemed to be bathed in sunlight. From the moment of its founding, that school shared in the suffering of the Korean people. It was established in May 1950, but had to close its doors less than a month later due to the Korean War. After the war, the school reopened and, true to its mission, the school prepared many girls to become talented women who would help build a prosperous country. In 1981, the school moved to the Eunpyeong district of Seoul, and in 1984, its name was changed to Sunjung Girls' Middle School. Our Tongil Group acquired this school in 1987 and brought it into the Sunhak Education Foundation. I have continued to give it support and attention.

In middle school I spoke little and developed a calm personality. I studied hard and always ranked at the top of my



class. I was pretty and modest and, as I was also quiet and well-behaved, I received love and attention from my teachers. My school life was uneventful; I only remember that I missed a day or two of school in the first year when I became quite sick. In my second and third years, I received an award for earning the highest grades in my class. I preferred to read in a quiet spot and listen to music rather than engage in social life or sports. My hobby was drawing. I enjoyed art and had some talent but set aside the possibility of becoming a professional artist.

For all three years of middle school I was the class representative on the student council, and in the third year I was the head of the student activities committee. I led many student activities, and this awakened my leadership abilities. One day when the entire school was gathered, I went to the podium and announced the decisions of the student council. The teachers complimented me on my poise and confident attitude. After

witnessing this side of me, which they had not seen before, one teacher commented, "Hak-ja seems gifted ...I thought she was just quiet and docile, but actually she shows good leadership skills."

During adolescence, I didn't worry about my life or losing my way. I credit this to my grandmother and mother instilling in me a deep faith in God and the habit of living in attendance to God. My mother, in particular, strictly guided my life of faith. Yes, there were times when I thought it difficult and wearisome, but I am grateful now, for it prepared me to blossom as the Only Begotten Daughter of God who one day would meet the Returning Messiah.

Within that atmosphere, I grew roots of unshakable faith. I read a lot. I enjoyed reading tales of the saints, and particularly *The Good Earth*, by Pearl S. Buck. The characters in that book struggle against nature and fate. The story helped me realize that ultimately, we must return to nature's

embrace, represented in that book by the earth. It is human nature to cling to God's embrace. I earnestly wished to be together with God, and for that reason I devoured songs and novels about the love of one's hometown.

I knew from a young age that God is my Father, and naturally connected everything I read to God. I cut off entirely from the harsh secular world and lived a chaste life as if I were a nun. I was aware that a higher power was guiding me, that my path had been prepared by Heaven. Especially during this time, the Bible was my close companion. I cried myself to sleep many nights after reading about God's history of creation, the tragic Fall, and the work of salvation carried out through historical figures who took responsibility at the behest of Heaven. I learned how they sacrificed themselves, and realized that humanity had been created to be loved as the children of God. After reading about God's bitter history and desire to embrace us, even though we bring so much pain and sadness, it was not just once or twice that I lay awake, unable to sleep, my heart aching to comfort the heart of God. I naturally continued to ponder ever more deeply what Rev. Moon had said to me about sacrifice. The question, "What can I sacrifice for God?" was shaping my life.

By the time I entered high school, the war had ended. During the postwar years, the

streets of Seoul were full of the wounded. Numerous children, including war orphans, were suffering from hunger and disease. Few people were able to get timely treatment when they became sick. I wanted to heal people's injuries, relieve their pain, and guide them to a brighter world. As it was time for me to enter high school, in the spring of 1959 I entered St. Joseph's Nursing School.

Without sacrifice and service, one cannot even begin to think one is living for the sake of others rather than for oneself. As I strictly cultivated my faith from a young age, I cherished a dream deep within my heart. That dream was to liberate my Heavenly Parent who, throughout history, had given everything for the salvation of humanity. I wished to free God from the chains of our fallen history.

We cannot meet God from a position where we are reigning over others. God seeks us out when we are silently working for the sake of those in greater difficulty than ourselves. I came to understand that when we think about God's Will from the lower position, from the position of offering and self-sacrifice, that is what will wash away God's bitter pain and allow us to feel God's presence with us. *☩*

In March 1959, True Mother (center of the second row) entered Saint Joseph School of Nursing, the predecessor of the Department of Nursing at Catholic University in Seoul. by the Cheonmyeong Praise Team and the viewing of a commemorative video. The video provided those who had gathered the opportunity to reflect on their journey of faith and renew their resolve as blessed families walking together with True Parents in the fulfillment of God's Will.

Beloved Blessed Families and Members around the world!
The New Year of 2026, the *Byeongo* Year (丙午年), is dawning. As we welcome the New Year, I sincerely pray that the grace and blessings of our Heavenly Parent will be abundant upon you, your families, and the foundations of your lives. The year 2026 is the Year of the Red Horse. With the vibrant energy of fire (火) combined with the dynamic vitality of the horse, we anticipate a year filled with overflowing energy and momentum.

At the beginning of 2025, the True Parents proclaimed the New Year's motto that will be handed down for generations to come, starting from Cheon Il Guk Year 13:

In the 13th year of Cheon Il Guk, when we attend the Creator Heavenly Parent substantially, let us, the blessed families around the world, become true sons and daughters of Cheon Il Guk who fulfill our responsibility as the chosen people in unity with True Parents!

Through this motto for the year, True Parents clearly revealed the three core elements of the providence that will continue from the 13th year of Cheon Il Guk onward for generations.

First, they proclaimed that the providential age is one in which we attend and live together with the Creator, our Heavenly Parent, in substantial ways.

Second, they defined our identity as the chosen people united with the True Parents.

Third, they clarified our mission as becoming the true sons and daughters of Cheon Il Guk who fulfill the responsibility of the chosen people.

This motto is not a message limited to the year 2025 alone; it remains a living request from Heaven for the New Year of 2026, the Year of the Red (Fire)

Horse. At this time, I hope we can once again deeply engrave in our hearts the love and earnest urgency of the True Parents contained within it, and I would like to share reflections on these three points.

First: The Providential Age

Last year, through the Cheon Won Gung Cheonil Sanctum Entrance Ceremony, Heavenly Parent, as the owner of the universe, reclaimed the rightful position to fully embrace and love all of God's sons and daughters. Accordingly, the original order based on the principles of creation was established, and, in the name of Holy Mother Han, the gates of the kingdom of heaven of Cheon Il Guk were opened wide.

We have now entered the age in which blessed families are called to embody the life of the earthly kingdom of heaven—attending in substance and living together with Heavenly Parent at the individual, family, and tribal levels. On October 28, speaking from the detention center, True Mother once again made clear, "The responsibility of the chosen people is to attend Heavenly Parent."

Second: Our Identity

Then why has witnessing been blocked? The reason is that we have not become model true families who are practicing true love. We must show the world true families that live together with God. Where there is true love, people sense its fragrance and are naturally drawn toward it. If I really become a true person and am transformed by true love, I can exert a great and positive influence on families, tribes, nations, and countries.

(True Mother, March 7, 2023, Hawaii)

On November 4, even while at the detention center, Mother once again earnestly urged, “Only the True Family Movement can bring about world peace.”

Third: Our Mission

True Parents are continually encouraging the blessed families to become the true sons and daughters of Cheon Il Guk who fulfill the responsibility of the chosen people. The essence of the mission of the chosen blessed families is to stand as the children of the direct lineage of the True Parents of Heaven, Earth, and Humankind, living as the true sons and daughters of Cheon Il Guk.

True sons and daughters are those who attend Heavenly Parent and True Parents, become one with them, and live together with them in every aspect of life. To do so, we must share the same will, the same thoughts, and the same heart and purpose.

The era following the Cheon Won Gung Cheonil Sanctum Entrance Ceremony is one in which blessed families must earnestly and substantially assume their responsibility. That responsibility can be summarized in two areas: education and the Blessing.

Therefore, we are the ones entrusted with the responsibility to convey the truth about Holy Mother Han to the world. Educating the people in the *Chambumo Ron* and the *Great Epic of the Chosen Han People of Korea* is a solemn charge Heaven has placed upon us. The True Love movement and True Family movement must begin with each of us and be fulfilled through our own lives. Interview with elder sister Moon Nan-young of the 430 Couples

Seventy Years on a Path of Hope

This is the story of a student of English and biblical theology who would one day emerge as a global leader, traveling across continents to advance women's movements and peace initiatives. At every turning point of history, she walked in step with True Parents, embracing a 70-year journey of faith. The life of our elder sister Moon Nan-young stands as a treasured testament to how women of the Unification movement have helped shape the cause of world peace. Through this interview, True Peace Magazine seeks to illuminate the providential path she has walked and, within it, to reflect upon the life course of True Parents as revealed through her journey.

Faith Found on the Path of Refuge

When the Korean War broke out, our family fled south from the North. Yet not all of us were able to make the journey together. Along the way, we were separated from my father, and from that moment on we never learned whether he was still alive. After enduring the harsh conditions of a refugee camp our family finally managed to secure a place to live. From then on, my mother would often say, "We have no choice but to rely on God," and she held steadfastly to her faith. Following her example, we children naturally came to seek the church and embrace a life of faith as well.

My mother later taught at Wonju Girls' High School. While accompanying her graduating students to the entrance examination site at Ewha University, she had an unexpected reunion. There, she happened to meet Choi Won-bok, a former classmate from her days at Ewha Professional School, the predecessor to Ewha University. Through this encounter, my mother first heard about the Unification Church, and from that moment our family began to walk a new path.

In 1955, the year I entered my first year of middle school, I accompanied my mother to meet True Father for the first time. The very first thought that came to me was, "How can he resemble my own father so closely?" Since my father had been taken away during the war and we had no news of him, I lived with a



constant longing in my heart. When I saw True Father, a powerful feeling surged within me, as though my own father were standing right before my eyes.

In those days, it was rare to meet someone with the surname Moon, and whenever we did, we naturally regarded one another almost as family. Perhaps because of that, the sense that True Father was like my own father welled up even more deeply and naturally from the very first moment I met him. That realization filled me with profound joy and gratitude.

Hope Unshaken Amid Trials

As the Unification Church began to grow, society branded it a “heresy,” igniting fierce controversy. The expulsion of students from Yonsei University and Ewha University intensified the uproar, and its repercussions reached even our family. At that time, the school where my mother was teaching demanded that my mother choose between her faith and her profession. She responded firmly, “How could I abandon the path of life I fought so hard to discover? I cannot give it up.” Having lost her husband and son while fleeing during the war, and having endured long years sustained only by her faith in God, she could not forsake the very belief that had carried her through.

We children resolved to give her our wholehearted support. We told her, “Even if we must go to an orphanage, we will support you, Mother.” With those words, we affirmed her choice. Thus, my mother left the school, and our family once again lived like refugees. Yet we never regretted that decision. Then something extraordinary happened: the students whom my mother had guided to a life of faith united with one heart and mind to begin building a church. Thus, in 1956, the Wonju Church was founded.

True Parents visited the Wonju Church many times thereafter, each visit bringing us invaluable guidance.

Among those memories, one moment remains indelibly etched in my heart. In those days, when the wounds of war had barely begun to heal and the nation was still burdened with orphans, widows, and deep poverty, True Parents proclaimed, “Now Korea will become the new Jerusalem of peace.” At the time, such a vision seemed almost unimaginable against the stark realities before us. Yet those words became the beacon of hope that carried us forward. For more than 70 years, they have sustained our journey, instilling in us the unwavering conviction that True Parents’ vision would surely be fulfilled.

Women Leading the New Era of Peace

In 1992, True Parents declared that in the era to come, women must take the lead, entrusting them with a new mission. Holding close to my heart their words—“Women must step forward and open the way with true love”—I began walking the path of the women’s movement and the cause of peace. That journey was marked by many moments too profound to fully express in words. One of them was the Korea–Japan Women’s Bridge of Peace Sisterhood initiative. Over the course of a year, women from the two nations—long burdened by a painful history—gathered together on thirty-eight occasions, and 160,000 pairs formed sisterhood bonds. As I watched Korean and Japanese women embrace one another, shedding tears as they opened their hearts, I was overcome with deep emotion and thought to myself, “At last, this day has come.”

Later, True Parents entrusted us with yet another mission: to heal the conflicts and divisions of the Middle East through a mother’s love. At that time, the region was in a perilous state, shaken by repeated suicide bombings. True Parents told us, “We cannot send you sisters alone into such a place. We must also offer our devotion together with you.” I still

vividly remember how they spent entire days offering devotion alongside us. Upon that foundation of heartfelt devotion, we were able to hold a Peace March in Jerusalem. There, we witnessed a profound and historic scene: Muslim and Jewish women, long divided by conflict, joined hands, shed tears together, and embraced in reconciliation.


To the Future Generation Who Will Open a New Era

Today, inter-Korean relations have once again grown complex, and the situation in the Middle East remains unstable. Yet it is precisely in times like these that I place great hope in our young people. It is the second and third generations—the leaders of tomorrow—who are called to bear fruit upon the foundation laid with the tears and devotion of their elders, while upholding the will of True Parents. For the remainder of my life, I wish to pray for them, encourage them, and support them as they walk the path that Heaven desires.

Recently, Missionaries Moon Shin-chul and Moon Shin-heung visited Guri Church and led a praise service. Watching them, I was naturally reminded of Hyo-jin nim. It feels like only yesterday that they

were children, yet now they have grown into leaders, guiding True Parents' global providence. Seeing this filled my heart with deep emotion. And as I reflected, I realized that this year marks the 70th anniversary of my joining the Unification Church.

Looking back, I sense that this moment represents a significant turning point in our movement's 71-year history. Especially at such a time, I believe that if we unite our hearts in devotion and love, we can advance more powerfully in the direction Heaven desires. If we faithfully carry this momentum forward, I am certain that even greater blessings—those Heaven longs to bestow—will surely unfold. Through my theological studies, as I reflected on God's providence for the salvation of humanity, I came to understand that new paths have always been opened in the midst of hardship. For this reason, I often shared messages under the theme, "Heavenly Parent Who Works Through Trials."

As I observe the future generation today, my conviction only deepens. I firmly believe that the more than 70 years of our history will shine ever more brightly, and that the victorious day long awaited by Heaven will surely come. With that faith and a heart full of gratitude, I will continue walking this path. 



Interview with the Cheonmyeong Praise Team, Singing with the Heart of Heaven

The earliest song of praise recorded in the Bible appears in Exodus 15. After crossing the Red Sea, the Israelites offered a song proclaiming God's victory in bringing their deliverance. This moment reveals that praise stands at the heart of worship and serves as a confession of faith. Though the times and forms of worship have changed, the essence of praise as a heartfelt confession to God remains the same. The praise team Cheonmyeong, which left a lasting impression at the recent National Tour Special Worship Services led by the Inheritors of Heaven's Love and Blessing and the 2026 New Year Prayer Gathering, also leads weekly praise services on the campus of Sun Moon University. True Peace Magazine spoke with former team leader Kim Bo-seong and newly appointed leader Park Su-eon to learn more about the message and vision Cheonmyeong seeks to share through their music.

Q. When did the Cheonmyeong praise team begin? What led to its formation?

Su-eon: The team began in 2023, when Missionaries Moon Shin-chul and Moon Shin-heung, together with UPA cadets, started holding praise services and campus outreach. We were naturally drawn together by our deep desire to experience Heavenly Parent's heart through praise and to draw closer to God.

Bo-seong: Our name, *Cheonmyeong* (天命), means "those who have received Heaven's mandate." It is a precious name

personally bestowed by True Parents through Missionaries Moon Shin-chul and Moon Shin-heung. Just as the name reflects True Parents' love and blessing, Cheonmyeong carries the mission of expressing, through praise, the indescribably profound heart of Heavenly Parent.

Q. How is the Cheonmyeong praise team currently organized?

Bo-seong: Cheonmyeong is made up of three main teams: the praise team, the media (systems) team, and the sermon

team. In addition, there are smaller teams that handle areas such as promotion, design, and accounting. The number of members changes every semester, but the group typically includes about 13 to 16 members, based on last year's size.

Su-eon: The praise team selects and rehearses the songs for each weekly service, seeking to convey grace through music. The sermon team establishes the theme for each semester and prepares the messages delivered during worship. The media team oversees all technical aspects—such as cameras and sound—ensuring that each service proceeds smoothly from beginning to end. In addition, we have MCs who guide the flow of worship, an accounting team that manages the team's budget and activity funds, and a design and promotions team that creates promotional materials and helps share news of our praise services with the wider campus community.

Q. We understand that Cheonmyeong holds weekly praise services during the semester. What kind of worship service are they?

Su-eon: The Cheonmyeong praise services are the times when we can lay down the worries and concerns we've carried throughout the week and, through praise and prayer, encounter Heavenly Parent and find renewed hope and comfort.

Anyone is welcome to attend—there's no need to register in advance. The praise services are open not only to current students, but also to people from outside the university and even from other regions. For those who can't join us in person, we share a YouTube livestream through an open chat link so people can participate online as well.

Q. With what spirit do you prepare for the weekly praise service?

Bo-seong: For me, the answer always comes down to sincerity. When every step of preparation is carried out with genuine sincerity, that spirit is felt not only through those leading the worship but also through the praise itself. There may be mistakes or moments that fall short, but if our hearts are sincere, that sincerity resonates with everyone who sings and listens together. That is why I often remind our team, "If what we offer is sincere, it will reach every heart. Let us approach everything with true sincerity."

Su-eon: I believe preparation is not simply preparation—it is already worship. That is why we approach rehearsals with the same heart and focus as the actual service, striving to move in harmony with one another. Even when we practice, we can feel Heavenly Parent's presence at any time and in any place. On the day of worship, we are filled with gratitude and joy as we offer that praise together with a wider group of young people. And each time we conclude a service, I discover myself renewed—reborn through a profound gratitude toward Heavenly Parent.

Q. How have young people responded to the praise services, and is there anything that has especially stayed with you through those experiences?

Su-eon: Many of the young people who have attended our praise services have shared that they experienced a kind of "resurrection of heart," and they continue to return faithfully week after week. For them, the Cheonmyeong praise service has become a healing space—a place where they can lay

down the fatigue and stress of the week and find true rest. At the same time, I have come to realize how much the grace of worship can be affected when our preparation falls short or when unexpected technical problems occur. In those moments, we feel the responsibility even more deeply. That is why we carefully reflect on the feedback we receive and strive to prepare each subsequent service with even greater devotion and sincerity.

Q. Cheonmyeong recently participated in the *Inheritors of Heaven’s Love and Blessing National Tour Special Worship Services* and the *2026 New Year Prayer Gathering*. Was there a particular moment that left a lasting impression on you?

Su-eon: Traveling across the nation with our team to offer praise felt like an immense blessing from Heaven. What remains most vivid in my heart are the moments when I was standing at the front of the church to sing, and I looked directly into the faces of the members. I could sense the love and earnest devotion of each person, and it moved me deeply. The times we shared praise together—exchanging energy and spirit with the congregation—are memories I will carry with me for a long time.


Bo-seong: We joined with the hope that our united voices might bring even a small measure of strength to True Parents and to the members. There were many moving moments, but what touched me most was seeing so many members praying and praising with tears. Their life journeys seemed to reach into my heart without words, and in that moment I too received profound grace through praise.

Q. What does “praise” mean to Cheonmyeong?

Su-eon: I see praise as a prayer offered to our Heavenly Parent. In those moments of praise, I find myself becoming more honest before Heavenly Parent and freed from everything that weighs me down. Through such experiences, I have come to realize that praise is not merely singing—it is, in essence, a prayer lifted to Heaven. Musical skill and talent certainly have their place, but above all, what matters most is the heart expressed through the lyrics. To sing with a prayerful heart, conveying to Heavenly Parent the words we long to share—that is what praise truly means to us.

Q. Could you share the direction and vision Cheonmyeong is pursuing for the future?

Bo-seong: Rather than a service focused mainly on form, we want to create a praise service that is truly alive and heartfelt. We hope it will be a place where anyone can come to Heavenly Parent without feeling burdened and find comfort and renewed hope. Instead of remaining within the campus, we hope interest in the services will naturally extend beyond the campus and reach even more young people. As the new semester begins and the Cheonmyeong praise services resume, we sincerely hope many will join us again this year.

Su-eon: We hope to continue creating meaningful praise services so that more people may come to feel Heavenly Parent’s heart. Looking ahead, we plan to experiment with a broader range of both onsite and online content, and to challenge ourselves in writing lyrics and composing music—crafting songs of praise that everyone can sing together. Beyond being simply a university club, our vision is for Cheonmyeong to help nurture a culture of praise in communities and nations around the world. And perhaps one day, Cheonmyeong will be invited to share praise on a global stage. 

Praise began as an offering of gratitude and a confession of faith to Heavenly Parent. That confession continues even today, sustaining the lives and devotion of believers. Through their songs, the Cheonmyeong praise team strives to help young people encounter the love and Word of Heavenly Parent and True Parents. Their unceasing efforts to discover how best to give voice to Heaven’s heart through praise will continue without end. As Cheonmyeong moves forward in shaping and leading a culture of heart, their journey is one to follow with great anticipation and hope.






60th Anniversary of the Korea Religions Association

Beyond 60 Years of Dialogue and Cooperation, Toward 100 Years of Action and Public Service

The 60th anniversary ceremony of the Korea Religions Association (KRA) was held on December 19 (Cheon Il Guk Year 13 HC 10.30) at the Korea Press Center. The event was attended by approximately 100 leaders from various religious denominations, who shared messages of peace and reaffirmed the vital importance of interreligious cooperation. In his keynote address, KRA President Hong Yun-jong emphasized that the Association will advance as an “action-oriented interreligious body,” committed to taking the lead in addressing pressing public and social issues. Following the ceremony, an academic symposium was held under the theme “The Social Role and Responsibility of Religion.” Participants reflected on the spirit of religious harmony and

pledged to take the lead in achieving world peace. The Korea Religions Association was established in 1965 as South Korea’s first pan-religious consultative body, initially comprising six major denominations, including Buddhism, Catholicism, and Protestantism.
